Shark Conservation

Luca Year 9 entered a competition last Autumn to take part in Steve Backshall's Deadly Mission Shark series. There were a number of stages to the selection process. He had to submit a short video explaining why he wanted to do it, then go through an online interview and, finally, to attend a Boot Camp weekend in Devon to prove that he had what it takes!

He was one of 6 children from the UK to be selected, joining 4 children from the Bahamas on their home island of Bimini, a very special shark conservation area. They all had to complete their PADI open water scuba diving training.

They spent 2 weeks filming their experiences diving in Bimini,





learning about the local sharks, marine conservation and Bahamian culture. As Luca is interested in film production and editing as well as wildlife, it was also the best work experience opportunity he could possibly have imagined, learning as much as he could from the BBC Natural History film crew as possible whilst he was there.

He has since created a Shark Saviours website to raise awareness for the plight of sharks, with links to useful resources; he has published an animated video short on TikTok to raise awareness of the issues of ocean plastic pollution, and he has raised over £500 for the Shark Trust running 100km in August.

The programme is due to air on CBBC at 6pm on Monday 4th September.
